The Women in Medicine Summit is a certified continuing medical education activity. 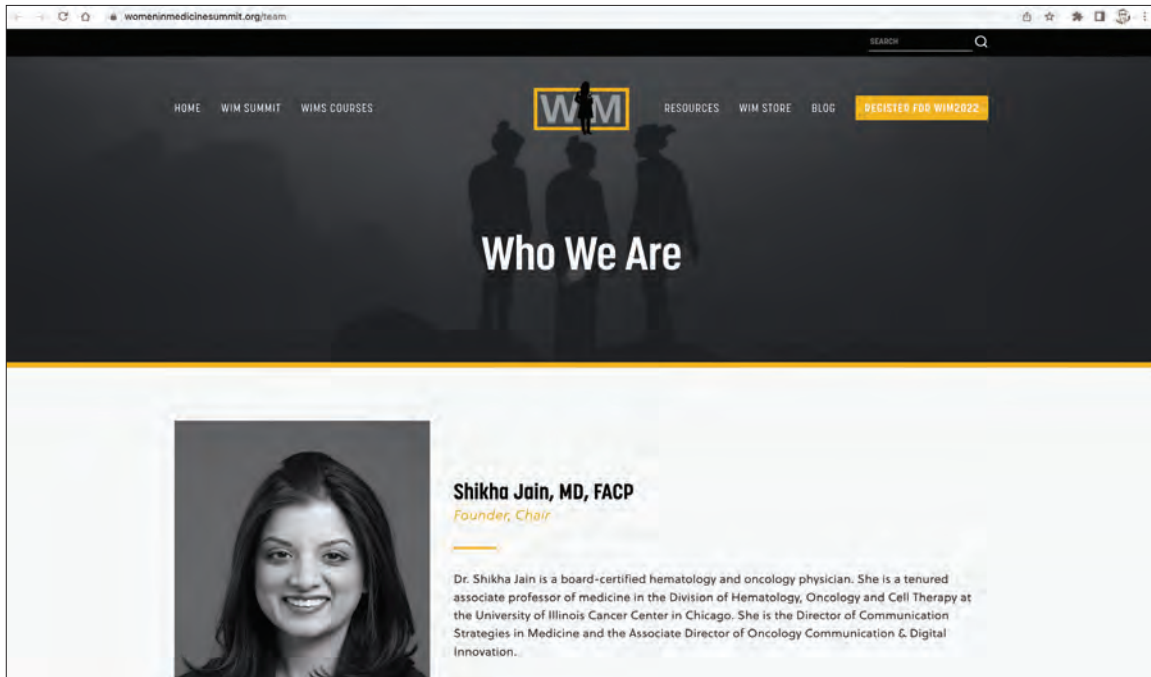

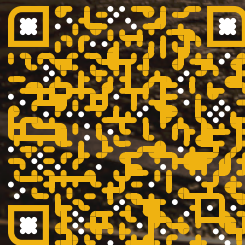
